Second World War resources

Islington Local History Centre holds a range of resources concerning the Second World War. Much of this material is divided into two sections, reflecting the previous organisation of the borough as the metropolitan boroughs of Finsbury and Islington.

METROPOLITAN BOROUGH OF ISLINGTON - ARCHIVE MATERIAL

Material available includes:

- Mortuary records, including civilian war dead records, police notifications and records of personal effects
- Civil defence records, including Emergency Committee and Civil Defence Committee reports, civil defence manuals and a card index of civil defence personnel
- Air raid records, including air raid warning records, bomb incident reports, a report on the response to the bombing of Mackenzie Road (1944), air raid damage reports (with card index by street) and a card index of air raid wardens.
- 'Civil defence in Islington' an account by W Eric Adams, ARP controller
- Warden's instruction book and certificates belonging to Walter Parry, air raid warden.

METROPOLITAN BOROUGH OF FINSBURY - ARCHIVE MATERIAL

Surviving records for Finsbury are less extensive but include the following:

- ARP memorandum, warden's book and examination papers
- Civil defence correspondence
- List and plans of public shelters
- Air raid records, including incident list and sketches, plans of bombed areas and bomb damage reports
- Records of civilian war dead, including some mortuary records
